A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As you know we do not have a great number of children in the parish. We do not have enough children to have a parish school nor enough children to have a formal Religious Education program. With that reality in mind, it is with great joy that two young members of our community are celebrating this weekend two sacraments for the first time. Isabelle Baute from our neighborhood (going into fourth grade and likes to "build a bear") and Jeremy Leafey from Ridley Park (going into fifth grade and likes to make movies and music) are celebrating First Reconciliation (Confession) on Saturday and First Holy Communion at the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday. We are grateful that their parents (David and Lailyn and Alex and Valeria) are "continuing to train them in the practice of the faith" as they said they would at the baptism of their children. We also are extremely grateful to Jackie Lanza who since last September has been sharing her time, and most importantly her faith with Jeremy and Isabelle to help them prepare to celebrate these sacraments.

In exhorting the people of Rome to share their faith St. Paul said to them, "how can people call on Him if they have not believed in Him! How can they believe in Him if they have not heard His message? How can they hear if no one tells them the Good News?" We extend our prayers and congratulations to Jeremy and Isabelle and a sincere thank you to their parents and to Jackie for telling them the Good News so that they can believe and be able to call on Him.

Speaking about getting to "know Him", do you know someone who would like to join the Catholic Church or who is baptized Catholic and would like to receive the other Sacraments of Initiation: Confirmation and/or Eucharist. If you are interested or you know someone who is interested, please have them be in touch with me.

This past Sunday, July 31st in Chicago, 10 young men professed their First Vows to the Augustinian Order. First Vows mean temporary vows. They profess them for a year at a time and then renew them each year for three to six years at which time they profess final or solemn vows. These ten men are from various provinces. Two of them, Dan Madden and Elizandro Contreras, are from our Province, the Province of St. Thomas of Villanova. For the past year they have been preparing as Novices at our Novitiate in Racine, Wisconsin. They spent the year becoming familiar with the "Rule of St. Augustine," with our constitutions, with various aspects of community life and with the meaning of the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. Please remember these men in your prayers and pray that others will be open to God's call to Religious life and to the priesthood.

As an Augustinian community, Fathers Paul, Tony and I share Morning Prayer (8:00 AM) and Evening Prayer (5:30 PM) each day. We pray what is known as "The Liturgy of the Hours" or "The Prayer of the Church." It is entitled that because this prayer is not just for priests or Religious, but for all the people of the Church. In that spirit, we would like to invite anyone who might be interested in joining us for Morning Prayer or Evening Prayer to do so. If you are interested, we would just ask that you let me know a head of time in order that we can make the necessary arrangements. Please know you are more than welcome.

A Biographical Sketch of an Augustinian Saint...... BLESSED JOHN OF RIETI, RELIGIOUS ◆ August 12th

John was born in Castel Porchiano, near the city of Amelia, in the region of Umbria, Italy, around the year 1318. He entered the Order in his teenage years and was sent to Rieti where he remained until his death. The Augustinian historian, Jordan of Saxony, described John as: "simple, humble and always cheerful; he was always friendly and social, and acted no differently from others in eating, drinking, and the other things that regard the common life of the friars; but he was unique with regard to his interior life. He was filled with love for his fellow religious and treated them with such charity that he was never heard to say or do anything contrary to fraternal love. He was reverential toward everyone, and especially toward the sick and visitors,

showing them the goodness of his generous heart." John died in 1336 at the age of 18, and immediately reports circulated of graces received through his intercession. He was buried in the Church of Saint Augustine in Rieti and his cult was confirmed by Gregory XVI in 1832. He is the patron of young professed friars of the Order.
