## *A word from Fr. Bill.....*

Dear Parishioners:

“How did it go over the weekend?” This is a question I was asked a number of times in the past few days. Of course, to what people were referring was how did things go with our first public Masses since March 15th. The answer is....overall things went very smoothly. We certainly did not have large crowds, nor did we expect to. We were informed that parishes in other dioceses and archdioceses that had public Masses before we did had very few people in attendance as they resumed public Masses. We had about 10 people at 2 of the Masses (Saturday 5:15 PM and Sunday 9:00 AM) and about 20 people at the other 2 Masses (Sunday 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM). This includes volunteer ushers, musicians, lectors and Eucharistic Ministers. I am very grateful for the presence of all of them because it very much helped things to go smoothly and prayerfully. Everyone was very cooperative with the social distancing, wearing masks, and sanitizing the space they occupied.

Once again, as I have said several times, I remind you that until further notice Archbishop Perez has dispensed the faithful from the obligation of physically attending Mass during the pandemic. He further directs that those who are sick and/or in danger of contracting the coronavirus not to come to Mass. We have a responsibility not to put our health or the health of others in jeopardy. If you do not physically come to Mass, please find ways to continue “to keep holy the Sabbath.”

Before last weekend, we said a number of times (by means of the bulletin, email, video and at the LiveStream Mass last Sunday) that we would resume public Masses first with all four Masses and then modify according to the numbers. Having had the experience of last weekend, I consulted on Tuesday evening by Zoom with our Parish Pastoral Council asking if we should modify the number of Masses. After a very good discussion of different views, it was decided that for the remainder of the yellow phase we will have just two Masses, the Sunday 11:00 AM and the Sunday 7:00 PM. When we move into the green phase we will resume the Sunday 9:00 AM Mass. One of the reasons for this is that there is a greater sense of community when there are more people. I am confident that the numbers will continue to improve as there will be better access to the city and as parishioners continually become more comfortable coming to church. We will continue LiveStreaming the 11:00 AM Sunday Mass while we are in the yellow phase. Some of the comments I heard last weekend were: “It feels so good to be back.” “Thanks for providing this for us.” “You had it all well thought out.” “It is wonderful to be here again.”

As we continue the process of once again being able to physically be together as a parish community for the celebration of the Eucharist, please be assured of our commitment to keep everyone healthy and safe. The three pillars for this are sanitizing (the church was professionally sanitized, parishioners bring wipes to sanitize the area they occupied, and volunteers sanitize after each Mass), social distancing (before Mass, designated seats during Mass, going to Communion, and leaving church), and capacity which certainly doesn't seem to be a problem for us as the Archdiocese has communicated we can have 50% capacity.

We continue to have parishioners saying the rosary together on Zoom on Tuesdays at 8:00 PM and the sharing of insights into next Sunday's scripture readings on Thursdays at 7:00 PM. Everyone is welcome to be a part of these Zoom gatherings. You can connect with us for the rosary on Tuesdays at 8 PM at 854 1235 0301 150408 and for the scripture sharing on Thursdays at 7 PM at 832 4986 0935 025786. Seriously consider inviting others to join us.

I had a Zoom meeting last Saturday morning with six members of the Filipino community and it was unanimously recommended to cancel the Sinulog for this August. We are happy to announce that Archbishop Perez will be able to preside at the Sinulog liturgy on August 15, 2021. To cancel it this year was a sad decision. The Sinulog is certainly one of the highlights of our parish year. But considering the numbers that often participate (over a thousand) and that many people come from a distance, it was thought it was prudent to cancel it this year.

As we announced in last weekend's bulletin, we are very happy to welcome Brett Schneider and Lindsay Wagar into the Catholic community. They have been meeting for the past year with Fr. Bill Donnelly and Patrick Lanza in the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Both Brett and Lindsay were baptized into other Christian faiths. They will be making a profession of faith to the Catholic Church, receiving the Eucharist for the first time and being confirmed at the 7:00 PM Mass this Sunday at which Fr. Bill (the older) will preside. Welcome Brett and Lindsay.

I was asked a few weeks ago if we were using money from the Capital Campaign to pay our parish expenses during the pandemic. The answer is Absolutely No —not a penny! First of all, that is not for which this money was given. Secondly, so many of you have been very faithful and generous during these months that it has not been necessary.
