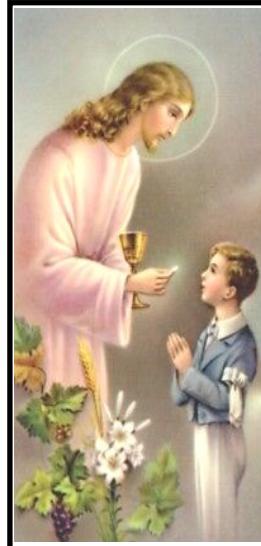

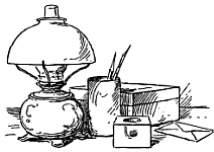

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

I would like to share some exciting happenings around the parish.....

First of all, we are thrilled to celebrate at the 9:00 AM Mass this Sunday the occasion of Eamon Thomas Stengel receiving Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist. I am very grateful to Jackie Lanza who has been meeting with Eamon on a regular basis since this past September to help him prepare for his First Holy Communion. The primary ones who have guided Eamon for this great occasion have been his parents, Matt and Megan Stengel. They with their three other children, Mary Kate, Theresa, and Rose, participate in the 9:00 AM Mass each Sunday. What a joy it is to see them each week. I am particularly happy to be able to give Eamon his First Communion because I also baptized him at the 7 PM Mass on October 26, 2014, probably my second baptism after coming to the parish. The first was earlier the same day at the 9 AM Mass. I don't know who has changed the most since that day, Eamon or me. I think a significant difference between us since his baptism is that he has more hair and I have less. Congratulations, Eamon, as you now totally participate with us in the celebration of the Eucharist for the first time.

Last Saturday, May 7th, we had the wonderful celebration of welcoming the Sister of the Liberty Bell home to St. Augustine Parish. After being shattered in the anti-Catholic riots of 1844, it was away from the parish for about 175 years and now it has come home. Auxiliary Bishop Timothy Senior presided at our prayer service, shared a reflection and blessed the bell. Sheila Hess, Representative of the City, extended the greetings of the City to us. City Councilman Mark Squilla, presented us with a beautiful Citation from the Philadelphia City Council. Jim Cuorato, President and CEO of the Philadelphia Independence Visitor Center, proclaimed a scripture passage from Leviticus. You can watch the 40-minute ceremony in three places on our website: the link where you can find all of our livestream liturgies, as well as on a page specifically designated for the Sister Bell on the Community and History tab on our website (the link is printed on the cover of this week's Bulletin) and finally on our parish YouTube Channel. There was some great Press coverage of the event which can be found especially on CatholicPhilly.com and a short report on 3CBS News Philly (both have links on our website). Please note a picture of this occasion on the cover of this weekend's bulletin.

On May 1st at the 11:00 AM Mass we had a visit from someone known as The Mystery Worshipper. This isn't unlike the Mystery Shopper, but someone who comes as a mystery visitor to liturgies around the world and critiques them. You can find out more about this entity on Shipoffools.com. Obviously, we didn't know "they" were here other than "they" placed a note in the collection basket which said "you have been blessed by a visit from The Mystery Worshipper. Read about your church soon on shipoffools.com." On Monday of this past week, I Googled the site and discovered very complimentary comments about the parish, especially the homily (Fr. Jim Paradis) and the music at the Mass. Someone said they knew I didn't give the homily because they mentioned in the critique that it was only ten minutes. This past Monday, two members of our Parish Pastoral Council (Bob Schuck and Bill Castro) and I visited the Ukrainian Sisters of the Order of Saint Basil the Great in Jenkintown. The purpose of the visit was to have a conversation with the Sisters' Provincial, Sister Joann Sosler, OSBM on how we as a parish can assist the people of Ukraine during these horrific days. After we discuss our conversation with Sister Joann with the members of the Parish Pastoral Council on May 25th, we will have more information for you. You can be sure you will hear more about this in the next month.

I thank God for the exciting things, signs of life, which are happening within our parish.

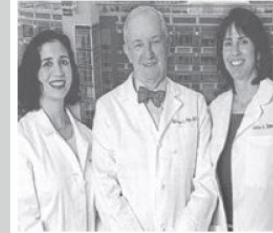
