

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As you know, we had a wonderful celebration of the Sinulog on August 19th. Even though it rained, it did not dampen our spirits (pun intended). It was a wonderful manifestation of enthusiasm, appreciation and reverence of our faith. This is especially important with the contemporary climate of the Church. Once again, many thanks for the many, many people who made this possible. In addition to the spiritual benefits, I am happy to inform you that this year's Sinulog profited about \$4300. This profit has allowed us to respond to two major needed improvements: three concrete pads on Marginal Street have been replaced, and there will be a seal coating and repainting of lines in the parking lot. The work in the parking lot was scheduled to have been done this past week (Wednesday) but it had to be postponed because of all the rain. I am very grateful to all those who worked so hard on the Sinulog and I wanted you to know that the proceeds were used to respond to these two very important needs on our property.

You know our church has been used for scenes in two movies: The Sixth Sense and The Shooter. Well, another one is about to be added to that list. On Tuesday, September 25th, scenes for a movie entitled, Seven Bridges will be filmed here. The movie stars Chadwick Boseman who was in The Back Panther. The scene is a flashback to a funeral of a police officer killed in the line of duty. Because the local streets will be closed off that day and there will be several hundred cast people here, we will not have a 12:05 PM Mass on Tuesday, September 25th.

Last week, I mentioned that the Paz and Nelson Santos were nominated and agreed to serve on our Parish Pastoral Council. This week I am happy to inform you that Matt Stengel and Zac Lowder have agreed to join the Council also. I am very grateful for their willingness to serve us in this way.

As you know, we are making great strides with our Capital Campaign. We currently have pledged just under \$530,000 or 70% of our goal of \$750,000. Hopefully, you already have seen some of the capital improvements around the property: 15 new windows of the Women of Hope residence facing 4th St., two renovated restrooms in the back of the church, and the beginning of the construction of a wheelchair accessible restroom in the back of the church (see cover of this weekend's bulletin). Some other projects which are in immediate preparation are: the replacing of the lighting in the church to LED lights, the restoration of the painting of the crucifixion in the sanctuary of the church and the replacement of 216 louvers in the church steeple.

The \$530,000 pledged represents 104 pledges. Next weekend, we will be showing our Capital Campaign video at all of the Masses and someone from the Steering Committee will be speaking about the campaign. If you have not been approached yet about making a pledge, please think and pray about it this week. Some people have made a one-time contribution. Some have made pledges to contribute three times over three years and some have made pledges over 36 months. For example, \$50 a month (less than \$2 a day) for 3 years would amount to a pledge of \$1800 over 3 years. Any variation can be worked out. You will see and hear more about this next weekend.
